Democracy returns at a late hour last night showed a complete triumph for the democrats in Massachusetts, where a governor and state tickets were chosen in a four-cornered fight; the selection of a democratic governor and state ticket in Virginia without contest; the secretary of fusion over Tammany in New York city, with indications of republican victory for the New York assembly and judicial ticket, and a victory for the democratic state ticket in New Jersey, where President Wilson and administration forces defeated the fusion ticket in the gubernatorial election. Hundreds of persons had surrounded a voting booth where a riot was in progress when Dr. Smith was knocked over and severely injured. The police failed to find any trace of the man reported to have been killed. The rioting resulted in a call upon the governor for troops.

New York, November 4.—Fusion carried New York city today, electing John Purroy Mitchell mayor by approximately 50,000 plurality and retaining control of the important board of estimate by a safe margin. Tammany might not even save the New York city offices out of the wreckage. I'M VINDICATED, SHOUTS SULZER

New York, November 4.—William Sulzer, ousted from the governorship of New York last month by verdict of a high court of impeachment, was elected to the state assembly today from the sixth district by a sweeping plurality, estimated at an exact vote of 2,000 or more. Sulzer ran on the progressive ticket and unopposed polled more votes than his republican and democratic opponents combined. His old neighbors on the east side rallied strongly to his support and it was very apparent that he had swamped the opposition.

Mexico City, November 4.—The unbecoming of conversation at the national palace tonight carried rumors regarding President Huerta's attitude in the face of Washington's demands that he retire, but the president himself preserved an enigmatical reserve.

Threat to Break Relations.

In the memorandum it is impressed upon General Huerta that his retirement from the presidency and non-interference on his part are the only steps which will save the American government. He is pointedly reminded that any attempt upon his part to break off all relations with the men connected with the coup d'état which he obtained the presidency, or to utilize in the proposed government any of those men, would result in the definite breaking off of all relations.

General Huerta is reminded that the United States is anxious to avoid trouble, as much for the welfare of Mexico, as to preserve international peace. He is daily urged to abandon power and to do it immediately, since the

David Lloyd-George, British chancellor of the exchequer, has attacked one of the laborers of the world, the American laborer to bring to a close the more flagrant abuses of England's system of landholding.

WELFARE EXHIBIT TO BE SHOWN HERE Will Be Brought to Atlanta From Conservation Exposition in Knoxville, Where It Attracted Attention.

With the assistance of practically every civic body of Atlanta and the cooperation of the Federation of Women's clubs, Superintendent Joe L. ... of the Associated Charities, has after two weeks of untiring effort succeeded in securing for Atlanta the Health and Child Welfare exhibit which has occupied a conspicuous place at the Conservation exposition, in Knoxville, Tenn. The display will be shown here from November 10 to December 10, inclusive.

The Health and Child Welfare exhibit is a combined display organized by the Russell Sage foundation and the Child Welfare Commission of New York. It was originally completed for the World Exposition in London, but it will be brought to Atlanta at a cost of \$10,000. The exhibit has been undertaken by the Atlanta Associated Charities.

Not only has the improvement of all civic bodies and the fact that it is being shown in the largest city in the South, but the exhibit also extends the Association of Women's clubs. The Atlanta Child Welfare Commission and other organizations have done much toward making for Atlanta the best equipped of cities.

Primarily the object of the exhibit is the training of the public opinion along the lines of the proper care for their own children. The exhibit is prepared by experts at an enormous expense and it is believed that it will depict the life of a child from infancy to maturity in a most interesting and instructive manner. It is believed that the exhibit will have a profound effect on the public mind and will be a great help in the effort to improve the health of the children of Atlanta.

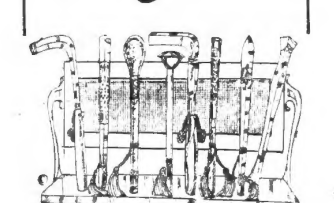
