

DROPS TO DEATH
IN THE AUSTELL
ELEVATOR SHAFT

A. A. Gray, Who Had Just Been Relieved From Duty, Drops From Roof of Building to Fourth Floor.

HIS BODY STRIKES TOP OF FREIGHT ELEVATOR

Girls Drop Flowers on Victim, Officials of Building Have No Idea What Was the Cause of Accident.

Before the hurried case of a large number of stenographers and other girl office workers on the fourth floor of the Austell building, the body of A. A. Gray, an elevator operator, was dragged from the top of a freight elevator early last night after he had fallen six stories.

As the bodies were lifted from the top of the shaft and stretched upon the floor, a trim little woman, who wore a blue blouse of chrysanthemum in her belt, stooped over and, pulling the body from their fastenings, dropped them on the floor.

A group of girl stenographers, who had witnessed the scene, stepped through the crowd around the body and, pulling bouquets from their waists, followed suit of the trim little woman.

Mrs. George Brown Gives Flowers. Mrs. George Brown, wife of Dr. George Brown, was the woman who donated the chrysanthemums, and whose aid was followed by the group of girl stenographers.

His fall was checked at the fourth floor, where his body crashed into a freight elevator driven by H. Don of 143 South Forsyth street. (The car had just left the floor when the accident occurred.)

Placed in Blood Spots. The car continued upward and had reached the adjoining floor when the driver discovered blood spots on the floor. Looking up, he caught sight of the dead body of A. A. Gray on the roof of the elevator.

Washington, November 8.—Sensational intimations that Provisional President Huerta of Mexico, would refuse to resign, administration officials stated tonight that the administration would be accomplished "in one way or another." They declared that every opportunity would be given him to retire peacefully and that drastic steps would be avoided if possible.

The chief development of the day was a call sent by President Wilson for members of the senate foreign relations committee, republicans as well as democrats. He had Senators Stone and Swanson with him, for an hour, and expects to discuss the subject individually with other members within the next two or three days.

Senator Must Go, Says Huerter. He is in communication with Senator Bacon, chairman of the committee, who early in the day had a long conference with Secretary Bryan.

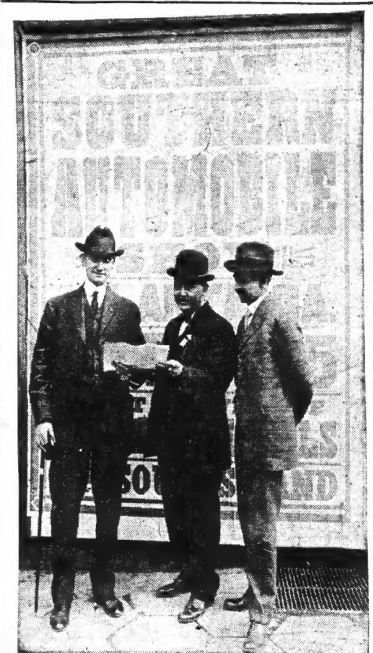

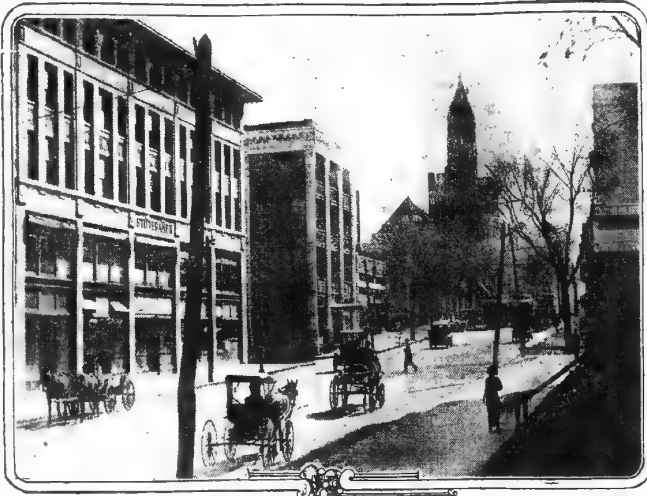

Some Can't's That Did A Few Sidelights on Automobile History

CANTO I.

The worth-while accomplishments in this world are usually things concerning which the wisecracks with one accord have raised their hands, and loudly proclaimed "It can't be done."

These men "foresaw the future of the motor car" and placed an order for 3,000 one-cylinder engines with the Leland & Faulconer Manufacturing Company, of which the aforesaid Mr. Henry M. Leland was the head.

Immediately all hands went up. "It can't be done." "They're crazy."

"Why, they can't sell 3,000 automobiles in the whole world." You could hear these things on every side. But in a little more than a year the whole quota of 3,000 engines had been used. Then another similar order was placed, then another and another.

In the meantime, the Leland & Faulconer Manufacturing Company and the Cadillac Automobile Company had combined their interests and Mr. Leland became the active head of the consolidated institutions which became the Cadillac Motor Car Company.

From almost the beginning it was hoped that the method of starting the engine by cranking it by hand could be improved upon. This led to experimenting with all kinds of devices and contrivances. Springs, compressed air, gas and levers of various kinds were tried out, but they wouldn't do.

Finally, the Cadillac Company announced for 1912 that its output of motor cars would be equipped with an electrical self-cranking device. It was not simply something to give the engine a push over and then stop, but something which would actually crank it and keep on cranking it if necessary.

Not only this, but the device would also furnish current for electric lights and for ignition. "Up went all hands again." "It can't be done."

"This sounded the chorus." But it was done and done more successfully than even its makers had dared hope for.

It was the greatest and most important single improvement since the inception of the motor car. It proved its case from the beginning. In the face of this, it was heretofore and it was abused. It was misrepresented and stories of almost every conceivable kind were circulated about it.

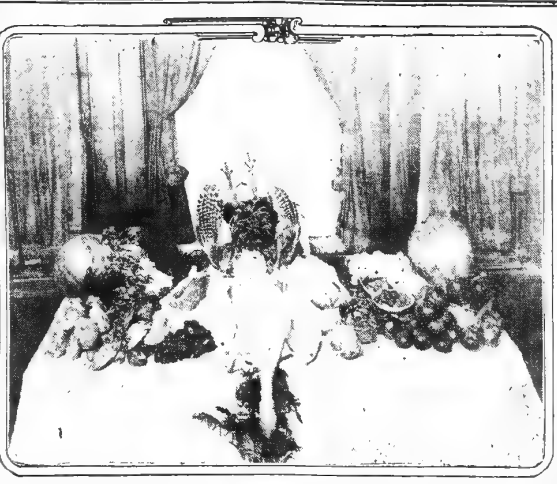

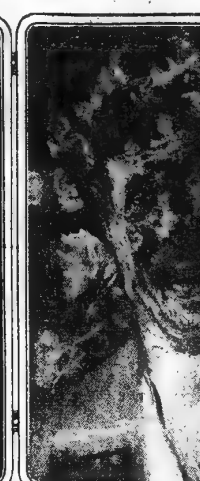

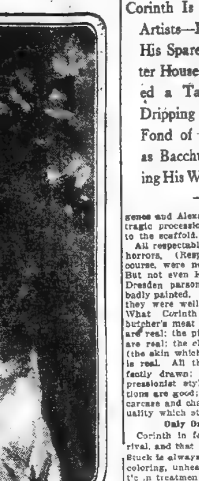

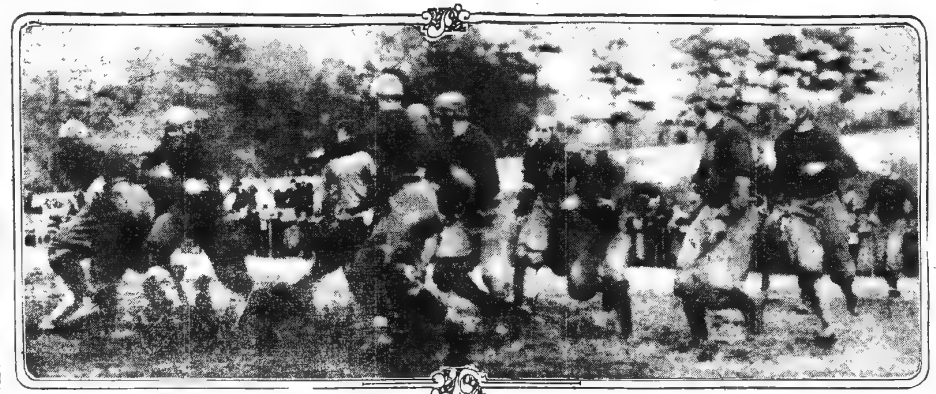

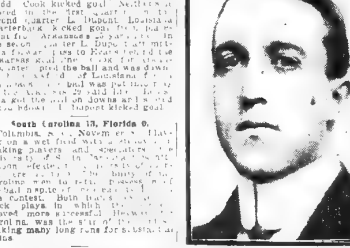

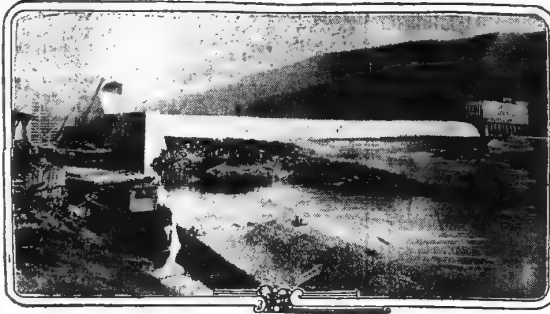

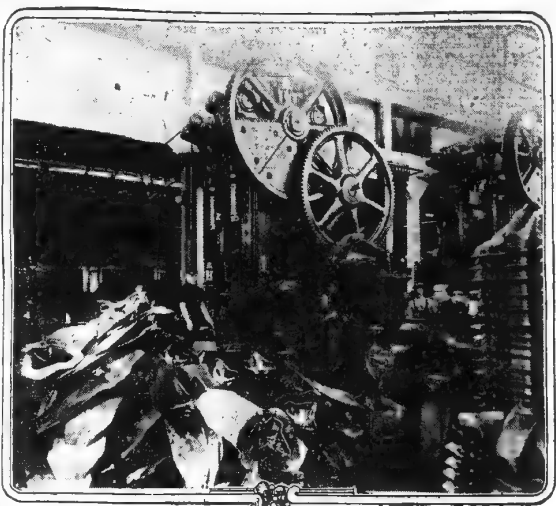
