G. H. McGuire Confesses Trying to Extort Funds From Asphalt Companies In Return for Contracts.

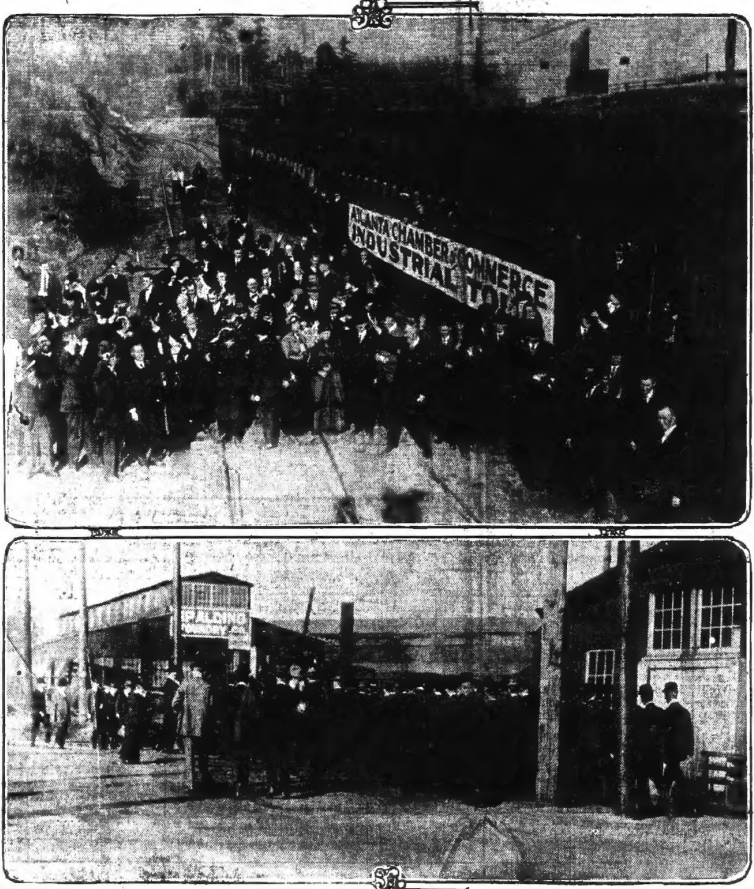
CONTRACTS WITHHELD IF CONCERNS REFUSED

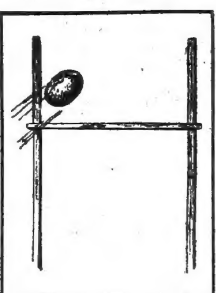
