ALL SALE OF BEER MAY BE OUTLAWED

Saloons' Future Depends on the Action of the Supreme Court in Cases Now Being Argued.

With the opening of the October term of the supreme court yesterday, began the argument of two cases which, if the higher court sustains the actions of the court below, will result in outlawing the sale of beer in Georgia and in confining the locker clubs within far narrower restrictions than they have enjoyed under heretofore.

Saloonkeepers' Future Dependent on the Action of the Supreme Court in Cases Now Being Argued.

The saloonkeepers against whom injunctions have been issued are, under the court's order, deprived of their licenses and also restrained from selling intoxicating malt drinks in the employ of another.

It is the first time since the prohibition law has been passed that the courts to determine whether or not the sale of beer is illegal and whether beer and other malt drinks may be sold under the so-called "locker" license.

The first case which was argued Monday was brought by C. W. Wickwood, president of the law enforcement league of Home against that league and the members of the Hill City club. The superior court of Floyd county granted an injunction against the club on the ground that liquor were being sold at it as a private club and that therefore a "blind tier." In violation of the prohibition law.
