The ban of the church was placed upon all the modern dances by Father George E. Rapier, of the Society of Mary, in a short and pointed letter directed to his congregation at the Sacred Heart church at the masses on Sunday morning.

His action follows a letter from the Bishop Benjamin J. Kelly, of the diocese of Savannah, which was read to the congregations of all the Catholic churches in Georgia on last Sunday.

In his letter Bishop Kelly said: "I must make plain reference to one form of very popular amusement. I refer to dancing. I am free to say that I cannot understand the great popularity of dancing, for the exercise taken therein is hardly gained in other ways. But that as it may, it seems to me the fact that recently there have been introduced certain dances extremely popular and offensive to good taste and repugnant to Christian morality. Can there be any doubts in the minds of Catholic mothers of their attitude toward these dances?"

Speaking to his congregation Sunday morning, Father Rapier explained that his remarks were caused by the fact that there were some persons who had misunderstood what he had said last Sunday. He said that he was generally made myself plain enough, so that he would not be understood in this instance.

"This is a matter in which the pastor has no authority to act. It is not for the federal government to make laws, neither is it the pastor of a church to issue orders which are in violation of the laws of the state or of the church in Georgia on this subject."

Bishop Kelly's letter, which was read to the congregations of all the churches in Georgia on Sunday morning, contained the following reading: "I do not condemn all works of fiction, but I do condemn those which are many standard works of fiction, which are full of immorality and which are full of immorality. IS OPPOSED PRESIDENT WILSON

As Congress to Remain in Session Until the Currency Bill is Passed.

Washington, October 12.—President Wilson let it be known tonight that I did not favor a recess of Congress at this time, but desired continuous and uninterrupted consideration of the currency bill.

The president, they said, had no idea of attempting to fix an arbitrary time when the currency bill should or should not be enacted into law.

While adverse to any haste that would impair the value of currency reform, the president is anxious that a senate committee can improve upon the house bill it will proceed to so.

Would Delay Other Reforms. With the plan for a revision of the anti-trust laws, tariff revision, immigration changes, consideration of prohibition treaties and appropriation bills, the president takes the view that the currency bill should be passed first.

Mr. Wilson's attitude toward the currency bill is not surprising in view of the fact that it is believed that many of the senators will be opposed to certain changes in the bill which will affect its general character and will leave it acceptable to President Wilson.
