CURRENCY HEARINGS
BEHIND CLOSED DOORS

Senate Banking Committee Is Amending Money Measure in Secret Session.

Washington, October 27.—The first day set for executive consideration of the administration currency bill by the senate banking committee resulted itself into a hearing held behind closed doors. Although hearings were formally closed Saturday, the committee spent today in secret session with Professor Jeremiah W. Jenks, of the University of the City of New York on the stand.

Professor Jenks in response to questions from members of the committee when he was on the stand last week returned to Washington to present a plan he had drawn for the establishment of a government controlled central bank to dominate the financial system.

The Plan of Jenks.

Professor Jenks' plan contemplates the establishment of a central federal bank under the control and management of government by officials of the branches established in various parts of the country. With this organization to take the place of the twelve regional reserve banks proposed in the administration bill, the Jenks plan follows closely the Owen-glass measure in the working out of details.

New York, October 27.—Isaac L. Vanderlip, president of the National City bank, today made a statement in response to a question given in Washington yesterday by Carter Glass, chairman of the house banking and currency committee.

HIS 11 CHILDREN WEPT AS HE DIED OF POISON

Senator Borah had given notice that satisfactory assurances were given that the nominees were opposed to slavery in the islands.

PRISON REFORMS
URGED BY OSBORNE

Man Who Spent a Week With Tells How to Better Their Condition.

Auburn, N. Y., October 27.—Seven-teen urgent recommendations for reforms in the management of the Auburn state prison were made by the state prison commission as a result of the week which the commissioner (chairman, Thomas Mott Osborne, spent behind the bars in the guise of a convict. Mr. Osborne presented the recommendations after a series of conferences this afternoon with the superintendent of the prison.

More Underwear Needed. Each convict should have three suits of underwear. The present time the condition of the bodies and underclothing of convicts is far from healthy because of perspiration. If an inmate were in each cell, a man could use one for wear, one for night, and one for bed.

Prisoners should be allowed to read newspapers and magazines. The rules for writing and receiving letters need drastic revision. "Take away" must be abolished. Punish him, but do not deprive him of his mail.

The system which sends men to prison for a limited period of time and then releases them without any punishment should be adopted for offenses. There is no sense of proportion or fairness in the present manner of meting out punishment for the same offense.

The sale of tobacco and alcohol should be regulated with greater care. The use of a white shirt is often harmful to the prisoner. In Auburn there should be a sale of machines, as in Sing Sing.

Moro Constabulary Will Be Disarmed. Manila, October 27.—A number of officers of the Moro constabulary, a unit of the Philippine constabulary, changed in a raid in which a Chinaman was killed. The Philippine constabulary are engaged in the pursuit of the Moro constabulary in Java.

Crushed to Death by Infuriated Bull. (Crick, N. Y., October 27.—William D. Hubertson, aged 27, was killed by a bull which he was tending on the farm of Douglas Robinson, brother-in-law of the late Robinson. Hubertson had been carting a barrel of manure when the bull had escaped from its pen and attempted to crush against the side of the pen. Death was almost instantaneous.

Former Oregon Tars Want to See Canal. San Francisco, October 27.—Fifty members of the former crew of the battleship Oregon have petitioned the secretary of the navy that permission be granted to enable for sixty or ninety days when the ship is sent through the Panama canal in 1915. These men live in and around this city, and all are desirous of again treading the decks of the warship on which they made a forced run from San Francisco to Manila in 1899, and arrived at Cuba in time for the destruction of the Spanish fleet.

No Hoosier Meeting for Mrs. Pankhurst. Indianapolis, Ind., October 27.—Mrs. Emmeline Pankhurst, the English suffragette leader, was barred from a meeting in Indiana here as had been planned. The arrangement was canceled today by the league of women.

Wilson Asked to Stop Separation of Races. Kansas City, October 27.—The National Council of a Congregational Church today appealed to President Wilson to use his influence to prevent separation of negro and white clerics in government offices throughout the country when it adopted unanimously a resolution proposed jointly by A. C. Crutcher, of Washington, and H. H. Frasier, of Atlanta, Ga., negroes.

Mrs. Downs Arrested. Mrs. C. C. Downs, wife of the well-known locksmith, of No. 39 1/2 Marietta street, was arrested last night on a charge of disorderly conduct. According to the police the woman was on a rampage and created a disturbance, excited the entire neighborhood.

WIFE SHOT BY HUSBAND
STILL AT DEATH'S DOOR

Emmanuel County Farmer Faces Mob Violence Should Brutally Treated Wife Die.

Swainsboro, Ga., October 27.—(Special)—L. A. Kennedy, the Emmanuel county farmer who shot his wife last Saturday afternoon, after beating her brutally with a buggy whip, and the best held by a shot gun, sits sullenly in his cell in the Swainsboro jail, not caring to discuss the matter, but stating Mrs. Kennedy is at the point of death, and according to the doctors in attendance, continues to grow weaker.

Most Brutal Beating. The doctors in attendance at the jail here believe that the beating Kennedy inflicted on his wife was the most brutal of the kind ever known in this county. Kennedy says that when he ran over the child with the buggy, the mother was the only one threatening his life. "It is my duty to care for her child, as he had been badly hurt, and I intended to destroy the child who hurt it."

Colombus Merchant Shot to Defend Self. Columbus, Ga., October 27.—(Special)—Marshall Martin, a blade road merchant, arranged before a magistrate to be discharged, having shot and killed James Smith, a negro, but the evidence showed that he acted in self-defense.

Cold Weather Kills Feed Crops in Texas. Amarillo, Texas, October 27.—The temperature dropped to 22 degrees here last night. The freeze destroyed a large amount of immature feed crops. The cold wave is prevalent throughout the Texas Panhandle country.

Insane King Otto to Be Dethroned. Munich, October 27.—The senate today voted to support a measure providing for the dethronement of the king of Bavaria, and the dethronement of the king of Prussia. 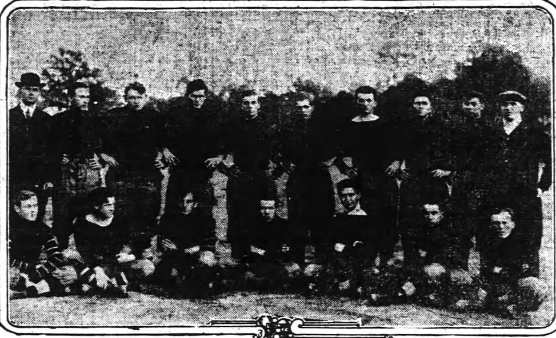
