

TEACHERS TO GET HIGHER SALARIES BY NEW SCHEDULE

Increase of Approximately \$7.58 a Month Proposed by Members of Salary Committee of General Council.

PAID STARVATION WAGE, SAYS COUNCIL MEMBER

Scale Provides Raise Annually Up to and Including Eleventh Year—Firemen's Claim Postponed.

The teachers and assistant principals of Atlanta schools will get an increase of approximately \$7.58 a month each if council adopts the new salary schedule.

The minimum salary for assistant principals under the new scale is \$748 for the first year and \$819 for the second year.

Colored assistant principals are to receive \$520.10 per annum for the first year and \$591.10 for the second year.

Colored teachers for the first and second years are to receive \$405.50 and \$476.50 for the third and fourth years.

Councilman Knight declared yesterday that the city should not pay more than \$145.50 for the month of the teachers' salaries.

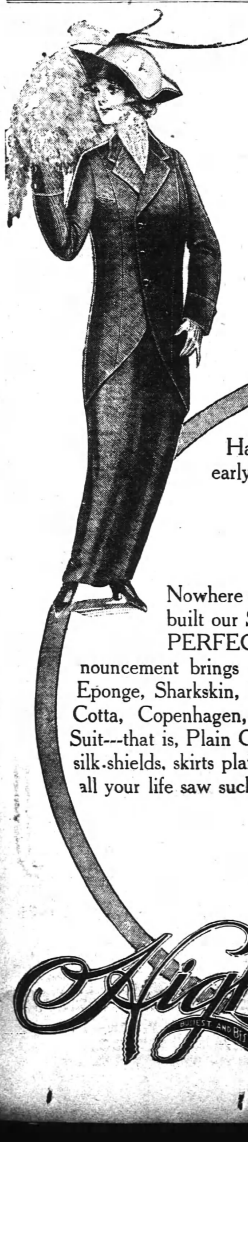

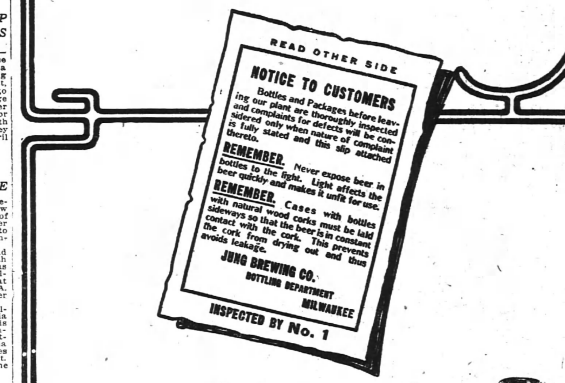

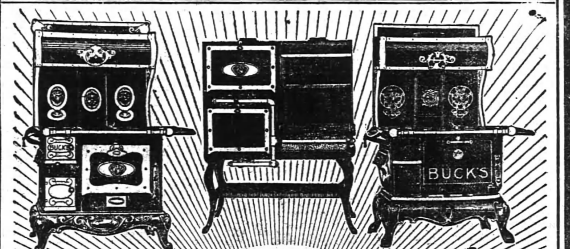
