

A dozen persons were trampled, some sustaining serious injuries.

The gates of the Polo Grounds were swung open at 10:55 a. m., and the rush of the thousands of fans was on.

Many times during the morning the crowd had threatened to overthrow the police guards and fill the seats which they had been waiting to buy, and the mob was becoming almost uncontrollable when the umpires arrived and looked over the field to determine whether the game could be played.

They found a pool of water near first base, and conditions in the outfield were bad as a result of the rain that fell during the night, but after a conference they decided to report to the National Commission that the field could be used.

The umpires' decision was transmitted to the National Commission and President Herrmann announced that the game would be played unless more rain fell.




