The original papers were taken from the clerk's office on November 15 through an order signed by Judge Hill, which placed them in the hands of the counsel for the defense for twenty-five days. BRIAN, Tex., Dec. 6.—Cold weather last night caused intense suffering throughout the Brazos river bottoms where hundreds of flood refugees have spent nearly 48 hours in trees. Most of these involuntary tree dwellers were negroes, driven from their cabins in the night, often with practically no clothing. The death list, which was not made public until this morning, passed today. At least twenty-five of the men, women and children were reported to have died.

More boats arrived in the bottoms today, but the water is so shallow that the arrival of the boats is of little benefit. The river today began falling in this section, giving promise that before night most of the urgent rescue work will be done. With the heavy rain falling below there, however, is the great worry of the night, for the water is rising and many of the white people refused to leave their homes.

The "declaration" states that intervention is undertaken to bring peace among bands which are ferociously engaged in a civil war. It is calculated to increase the antagonism of Mexico to the United States. It consists of ten articles, which give the reasons why war is necessary, general instructions regarding a blockade and an outline of the military strategy to be followed against the Mexicans.

The amended motion for a new trial was filed by attorneys for the state until a few moments before the hearing began. The motion was based on alleged irregularities in the hearing. The state attorneys sought a postponement of the hearing.

The pope was deeply grieved when he learned of the death of the cardinal. Orsini was a member of the sacred college since 1878. He was bishop of Ostia and Velletri, arch-chancellor of the Roman university and prefect of the congregation of ceremonies.

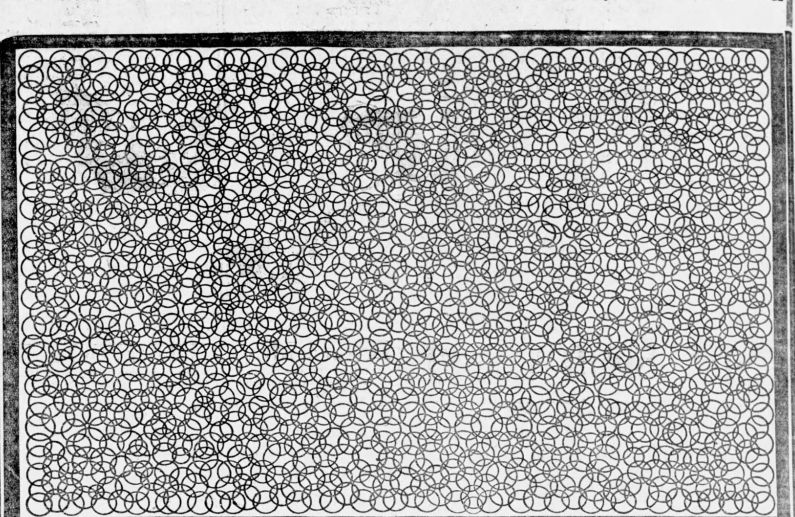

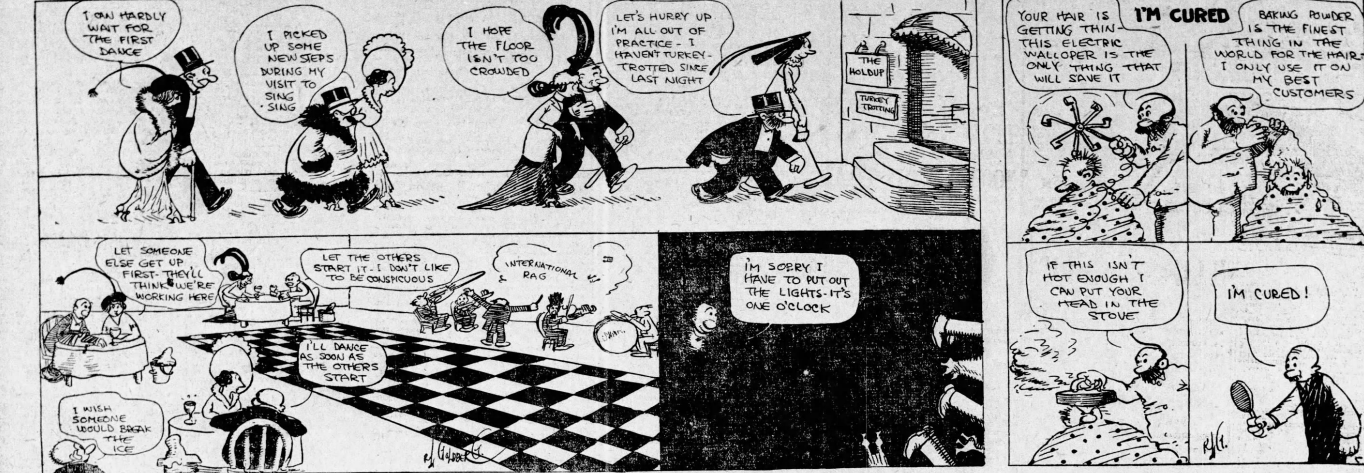
