

Constructive Policy.

The annual report of the Secretary of the Interior on. Franklin K. Lane, is notable for its cor

Hon. Franklin K. Lane, is notable for its conciseness and its distinctly constructive tone. Without entering into detailed recommendations, the Sorfetary electric and its distinctive control of the Sorfetary electric and its distinctive control of the Americans.

Commenting upon the disappointment which hitherto has attended the Government's attitude toward Alaska and the natural treasure of the West, he aptity observes: "We have advantured upon a new policy of administering our affairs and have not developed adequate machinery. We have called a hait on methods of spoliation which existed, to the great benefit of many, but we have falled to substitute methods, sane, healthful and progressive, by which the normal enterprise of an ambitious people can make full use of their own resources. We abruptly closed opportunities to the monopolist, but did not open them to the developer."

The Secretary evidently feels that conservation. It was important mere preservation. The Department of the Interior has to do with one of the most important and far-reaching branches of national affairs. It must watch over the interests of three hundred and ten thousand, for whom it holds in trust property worth nearly nine hundred million dollars. It must care for the national parks with their leastmable treasure of seemle heastly; must distribute some one hundred and sixty-few million dollars a year to eight hundred thousand pensioners. It issues each month, as Secretary Lames report, shows, an average of more than five thousand patents to inventors in the United States and foreign countries. "Every uniter in the land is intrested in those means which are being taken to prevent mine accidents and to realize more fully the country's mineral wealth." This department "must measure the waters of a thousand streams, survey the lands of all the States and look beneath the surface to see what they contain."
