AMERICAN BANKERS HELPING REBELS?

Rumored That Loans Are Pending for Half-Million of Arms and Ammunition

(By Associated Press.) EL PASO, Tex., Oct. 6.—A dispatch from Washington to the Morning Times says that American bankers, according to constitutional agents in Washington, have agreed to lend \$500,000 to the rebel forces. The loan is to be secured by a lien on the customs receipts collected by the rebel government. The money is to be expended on arms and ammunition. Francisco Siles, through whom the announcement was first made, is said to be on his way to meet General Carranza at Hermosillo.

URGENT CALL SENT OUT TO DEMOCRATS

Telegrams Call Congressmen to Washington to Make Up Quorum

(By Associated Press.) WASHINGTON, D. C., Oct. 6.—Democratic house leaders, apprehensive at the absence of a quorum of members in Washington, were sending out urgent telegrams today. Tuesday the urgent deficiency bill, carrying provisions abolishing the common court and removing all deputy revenue collectors and deputy United States marshals from all service, is scheduled to come before the senate for action on Monday. If caught without a quorum, Democrats will be helpless and the measure carrying \$100,000,000 worth of patronage and some pension probably jeopardized.

YUAN SHI KAI AGAIN HEADS YOUNG REPUBLIC

Three Ballots Necessary to Choose President of Chinese Republic

(By Associated Press.) PEKING, Oct. 6.—Yuan Shi Kai was today elected president of the Chinese republic for a term of five years. He received the necessary two-thirds vote of the first ballot. The vote on the first ballot was Yuan Shi Kai, 471; Li Yuan Heng, 152. The remainder of the 759 ballots was scattered among twenty other candidates. The second ballot resulted in a vote of 497 for Yuan Shi Kai and 142 for Li Yuan Heng. A third ballot was necessary, 528 votes being required for election. Li Yuan Heng, who is the provisional vice president, declared that he would not accept a nomination for a second term.

MASKED BANDITS GET \$16,000 IN HOLDUP

The money was later found hidden in a stone wall a short distance from where the hold up occurred. The robbers captured the cashier and the driver, Charles Ryan, with their revolvers. The highwaymen jumped over a fence and started through the woods, with Koeb running after them. The robbers fired two shots. A trolley car passed and the robbers were seen to escape. Several of the welcoming delegates were accompanied by bands. Governor General Harrison's address embodied instructions received from President Wilson stating broadly the administration's policy toward the Philippines. The instructions declared that every effort would be taken with a view to the ultimate independence of the islands. 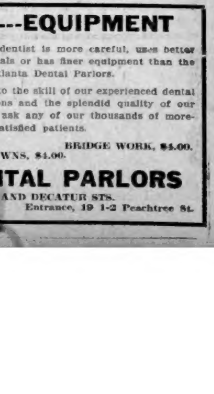

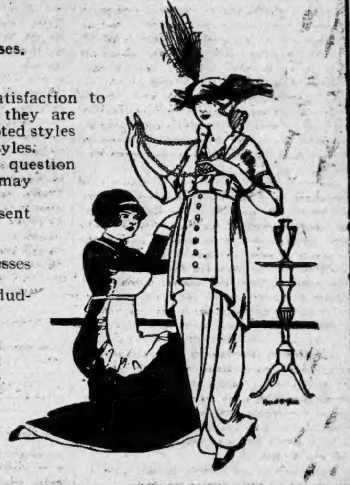

While the eminent Mr. Mack possesses a hundred-thousand-dollar infield, the equally eminent Mr. McGraw has \$100,000 worth of pitching flesh to mast it. So far as pitching is concerned--that is, comparative pitching based upon an entire season's form--there isn't even a debate.

Directly off the reel McGraw has two men to offer Bender and Plank in Mathewson and Marquard--standoff in Mathewson against Bender and the best of it in Marquard against Plank.

And, in addition to this, he has at least two others who are far and away better than Mack's third.

PITCHING TO THE GIANTS. Then Mack had three pitchers to offer against McGraw's two. He had Bender, Coombs and Plank to shoot against Mathewson and Marquard--the latter a twenty-two-year-old youngster.

Now McGraw has four fine pitchers to push against Mack's two--so where Mack was stronger by 11-3 per cent in 1911, McGraw is stronger by 50 per cent in 1913.

HOW THIS WILL WORK. McGraw's position is this: He has four fine pitchers who are blessed with an abundance of stuff, steady reliable, and ready to operate at a moment's notice.

He has a veteran right-hander--Mathewson--the wisest pitcher in baseball; a fine left-hander in Marquard, wonderfully improved over past years in judgment and control; a mountainous spit-batter in Tesreau, who has apparently just regained his stride; a wise, brassy, sly-arm worker in Demaree, who has won more close, low score games than any worker in his league.

Mack's position is quite different. He has Chief Bender--one of the greatest "money" pitchers that ever pegged the sphere; a great left-hander in Edna Plank, but one who has passed over the crest of the hill, and for two months has been badly punished in his own circuit--who, at best, will be good for only one game; unless he can wedge in a four or five day rest; and after these two a fair set of youngsters who give promise but who are not to be rated with any of the four that McGraw can use.

AN ADAMS OR A BENTLEY. It is evident unless Mack's slugging club can demolish the Giant infield almost utterly that his Athletics can hardly expect to win with only Bender and Plank. These two will only be good for four games, and to turn this trick they must gather in every start.

So unless Coombs can discover a Babe Adams or a Hugh Bennett (from Shawker, Bush or Brown--he is up against a robust handicap--the same handicap which crushed the Giants so terrifically that last June in 1911 when Mathewson and Marquard had fired their final ammunition and there was no one left to check the charge.
