In Forty-Minute Speech George
Says Solution of Problem Is in Postal Savings
Bank System

CURRENCY BILL DOES NOT
SOLVE ISSUE, HE STATES

Best Way to Distribute Bond-
ed Debt, He Declares, Is to
Remove Restrictions on
Savings Bank System

WASHINGTON, Sept. 22.—Congress-
man William S. Howard today ad-
dressed the house on the postal sav-
ings bank system, a measure of trans-
ferring the bonded indebtedness of
the government from the national
banks to people. He spoke for forty
minutes by unanimous consent, and
was given attentive hearings. Some of
the utterances provoked applause.
Howard, a congressman, declared that
the greatest problem confronting
the framers of the administration cur-
rency bill, which passed the house re-
cently, related to the proposed retire-
ment of the \$742,000,000 of government
2 per cent bonds now held by the
banks and used by them as a basis of
national bank circulation. He stated
that the tariff bill have narrowed down
the issue to the question of retir-
ing the 2 per cent bonds with an is-
sue of 2 1/2 per cent bonds. He stated
that the bill would be settled propo-
sitions, but that the distribution

tions and limitations that now con-
