20-Year Jail Sentence for Connally.

ATLANTA, Ga., Feb. 24.—Jim Connally, the negro who was the State's principal witness in the Leo Frank case a few years ago, and who served a year in the chain gang for being an accessory in the killing of Mary Phagan, for which Frank was condemned to be hanged, was sentenced Monday to serve twenty years in the State penitentiary for burglary. Connally was convicted of having broken into the drug store of Arthur Conn, another negro, on the night of Jan. 15.
