
DORSEY BECOMES GOVERNOR

Prosecutor of Frank Inaugurated,
Succeeding Nat E. Harris.

ATLANTA, Ga., June 30.—Hugh M. Dorsey was inaugurated today as Governor of Georgia, succeeding Nat E. Harris.

In his inaugural address Governor Dorsey recommended that the Legislature create a State Council of National Defense to aid the Federal body, pleaded for new taxation for schools and better schools for negroes, mentioning the fact that approximately 50,000 negroes recently had left Georgia for the North and East.

Mr. Dorsey attracted nation-wide attention as the prosecutor of Leo M. Frank.
