

FRANK FILES EXCEPTIONS.

Formal Protest Against Judge Hill's Ruling Against His Appeal.

ATLANTA, Ga., July 6.—Attorneys for Leo M. Frank today filed a formal bill of exceptions to the action of Judge Ben H. Hill in sustaining the demurrer of the prosecution to the motion to set aside the verdict convicting him of the murder of Mary Phagan. The bill of exceptions will be transmitted to the State Supreme Court within fifteen days.

Argument on the motion, which is based upon the charge that Frank's constitutional rights were violated when the verdict was returned in his absence from the court, will not be heard until October.

The other motion in the case, appealing for a new trial on the ground of newly discovered evidence, is already before the higher court, and will probably be argued late in July.
