

DORSEY RUNS FOR GOVERNOR

Lawyer in Frank Case Will Be Candidate In Georgia.

ATLANTA, May 6.—Hugh Dorsey, Solicitor General of Fulton County, who came into prominence as the result of his handling of the Leo M. Frank case, today announced his candidacy for Governor. Mr. Dorsey will run on a law enforcement platform.

His entrance will have the effect of reviving interest in the case of Frank and it may be made a political issue. With his announcement there are now three candidates. Governor Nat Harris, who forced stricter prohibition laws on Georgia by calling an extra session of the Legislature, is seeking re-election and Dr. L. G. Hardman, also pronounced "dry," wants the place.

They are sure to split the prohibition forces, and while Dorsey has made no announcement of his stand for prohibition or local option, he will naturally get a large part of the "wet" vote.
