# PLAN AID FOR FRANK.

---

**Chicago Women to Canvass City  
with Clemency Petitions.**

CHICAGO, May 7.—Plans for a "Leo M. Frank day," on which hundreds of women of all nationalities, equipped with petitions, will ask citizens of Chicago to sign protests against Frank's execution, are being completed by the Leo M. Frank Committee. It is likely that Monday, May 17, following the mass meeting in Powers's Theatre on Sunday afternoon, will be selected.

Among the speakers at the mass meeting will be Bishop Samuel Fallows, Charles G. Dawes, Patrick H. O'Donnell, ex-Judge McKenzie Cleland, the Rev. P. J. O'Callaghan, Grace Wilbur Trout, Mrs. Leonora Z. Meder, the Rev. Johnstone Myers, and the Rev. S. J. Siedenbergl.

Petitions will be circulated at the meeting and resolutions asking for clemency will be adopted and sent to the Georgia authorities. On the next day the women of the city will make a concerted effort to obtain signatures to petitions urging Executive clemency in behalf of Frank. The women will be scattered throughout the city. It is planned to have two women on each corner and eight women at each intersection of the loop. The same course will be followed in the outlying districts.
