## **WILL HEAR FRANK'S PLEA.**

### **Georgia Commission to Fix a Date at Conference Today.**

ATLANTA, Ga., May 16.—Members of the State Prison Commission will hold a conference tomorrow morning to decide on the date for hearing arguments on the petition of Leo M. Frank for a commutation of his sentence to life imprisonment. The conference was called at the request of Frank's attorneys.

The next regular session of the commission will be held during the week beginning Monday, June 7, but it is stated that Frank's attorneys hope the commission will call a special session in advance of its June meeting to dispose of the case. It is expected the hearing on Frank's petition will require at least three days, and that because of the long record the commission will take several days, perhaps a week, to consider it after the hearing is held, although the commissioners have been in possession of copies of the record ever since Frank filed his petition about two weeks ago. It is understood they have all read through the record one or more times.
